The Erasmus+ seminar '**Learning how to facilitate youth camps by working together**' invites you to immerse yourself in the world of international youth exchanges and work camps and discover how to become a responsible, inclusive and inspiring leader.

Animating a group is not just about being a leader : it's about **building confidence, involving everyone** in decisions, **valuing skills** and transforming **cultural differences** into collective strengths. It also means learning how to manage the challenges of **meeting the local population**, creating a respectful environment (safety, consent, equality, rules of conduct) and making every shared moment – a meal, a daily task, a work session – an opportunity for learning, empowerment and encounter.

The programme includes **discussions, role-playing, practical tools, construction activity** and real-life experiences so that you, in turn, can bring to life an international youth exchange or work camp where everyone feels involved, recognised and safe.

Create an opportunity to exchange insights on camp leadership, discuss real situations and seek advice from others. Nurture links between camp leaders throughout Europe.

We also hope that participants will take the opportunity to propose and lead their own workshop on this topic. This will enable everyone to share their experiences and practices, and to enrich the seminar with a variety of different perspectives.

*THIS IS NOT A MASTERCLASS

An international youth exchange or a workcamp can take many different forms, depending on the camp leader. Political activism, historical contexts, financial constraints, intercultural dynamics and your own personal perspective all influence the way you lead. Our aim is not to tell you what to do step by step, but to share with you the different approaches and experiences we have developed, so that you can find your own way of leading.

LOCATION // // // // // LA FERME DU FAÏ

Since 1989, the Les Villages des Jeunes association has managed, run and renovated the reception centre of Le Faï in the Hautes-Alpes. The site was previously a farm. It is now a place for young people and adults experiencing family, health or professional difficulties, who need to take some time to recharge, acquire new skills and reflect on their plans.

The international projects that we organise provide an insight into the wider world. Here, people of all ages and backgrounds come together through work and community life.

We hope that everyone will come with an open mind, as this is at the heart of our project.



FOOD & BOARD //

The old farm buildings have been transformed into group accommodation. Participants will sleep in shared bedrooms of 3 to 8 people and will have access to all facilities of the centre (dining room, kitchen, showers and toilets).

Daily life is organized collectively: menus, shopping, activities, etc. We organize shopping trips once or twice a week. We go down to the city in the vehicles available on the site.

On the site, it's important to know that **you won't be eating meat every day**. Even if meals are not strictly vegetarian (except for volunteers who request it), Solidarités Jeunesses attaches great importance to protecting the environment and therefore wishes to reduce meat consumption on the work sites.
