ABOUT THE PROJECT:

REFORE NETWORK is a European project created by the association Auryn and funded by the European Union's CERV Programme. Its main goal is to build a strong network of European organizations and young activists committed to promoting historical memory, with a special focus on younger generations.

The project brings together participants and organizations from Portugal, Spain, France, and Italy to recover and value the remembrance of totalitarian regimes and resistance movements that marked Europe, particularly during the 20th century. Through European mobilities and local activities, Refore Network raises awareness of our shared history, fosters mutual understanding among European citizens, and promotes a common culture of memory.

At the heart of the project is the creation of open and diverse youth activist groups in each participating country, working on research, education, and awareness campaigns. Refore Network also places strong emphasis on human rights and democratic values, giving visibility to forgotten voices, especially women and exiled people, and creating spaces for reflection to counter hate speech.



OBJECTIVES OF THIS MOBILITY:

- To foster coexistence and joint learning among citizens from different European Union countries, especially among European youth.
- To promote social cohesion and European values.
- To raise awareness at the European level of spaces linked to exile and refuge during the Spanish Civil War.
- To address the next steps to be taken by the REFORE Network and close the project.

TYPE OF MOBILITY:

This mobility, which is the final one of the REFORE Network project, will be a little different from the others. During this week, we will immerse ourselves in the history and journeys of people living in Catalonia who were forced to flee their country and go into exile in France following their defeat in the war and the establishment of a dictatorship.

To better understand their experiences, we have designed an itinerant project that will follow in their footsteps. Throughout the week, we will stay in different locations and travel more than during the other mobilities.

This final week together will therefore take a slightly different form from the previous ones.

Be ready and stay open-minded!

PARTICIPANTS:

The project brings together 25 people in total:

- Link (Italy): 6 participants
- Intercultura (France): 6 participants
- Aequalitas (Portugal): 6 participants
- Auryn (Spain): 3 participants
- La Víbria Intercultural (Spain): 4 participants



Profile:

At least 50% of the participants from each organisation must be young activists (maximum 30 years old), open to non-formal learning, and committed to both local actions and transnational activities of REFORE.

What matters most is your curiosity, motivation, and willingness to fully participate in a diverse, multicultural environment. We expect all participants to be actively involved in every session throughout the project.

TRAVEL:

City of arrival: BARCELONA

- The travel budget for each participant is **€250** (round trip).
- Please try not to arrive at Barcelona airport later than 7pm.
- Travel expenses will be reimbursed to the partner organisations by **Auryn** after the project.
- Participants must keep and later send all original travel documents, including invoices, boarding passes, receipts, or tickets used during the journey. This is essential for the reimbursement process.
- You must travel in the most efficient way available: choose the cheapest and most environmentally friendly option.



How to get to Barcelona:

By plane

IMPORTANT: You must arrive at Barcelona El Prat Airport.

DO NOT fly to Barcelona Girona Airport, which is located in another city more than one hour away from Barcelona.

- From the airport, take the **Aerobus A1 or A2** to Plaça Catalunya (round-trip ticket costs €12.85).



By train:

Arrive at **Barcelona Sants** Station.

By bus:

Arrive at **Estació Barcelona Nord**.

From there, we will provide more information on how to reach the hostel very soon. (The first hostel will be in Barcelona).

ACCOMMODATIONS:

As previously explained, we will be staying in different locations throughout the trip. We would like to inform you that participants will be accommodated in hostels, in shared rooms, and will also share bathrooms. Rooms are equipped with bedsheets.

WHAT TO BRING:

- CLOTHES AND WEATHER:

March in Catalonia is usually quite mild (around 10-15°C), but please check the weather a few days before traveling and bring appropriate clothing.

- HEALTH AND INSURANCE:

Having medical insurance is mandatory (European Health Insurance Card or equivalent). Please make sure you have it before your trip.

- HYGIENE:

Bring your personal hygiene items and a shower towel.

- ESSENTIAL:

Bring your reusable water bottle.

- INTERCULTURAL SHARING:

Bring a small snack, drink, or food from your country to share with the group.




ABOUT THE HOST:
